

Your Kitten's First Year

New Kitten Check List: Are You Ready?

- Kitten food and bowls
- Collar
- Safe toys
- Grooming brush
- Nail trimmers
- Toothbrush and toothpaste

VACCINES

Your kitten will need various vaccines during its first few months.

- The FVRCP vaccine should be given every 3-4 weeks until 16 weeks of age
- The Feline Leukemia vaccine should be given twice. The first vaccine is given and then 3-4 weeks later a booster is given.
- Your kitten should be at least 16 weeks of age to receive its first Rabies vaccine.

OTHER SERVICES TO CONSIDER

- A fecal sample should be tested for intestinal parasites
 - If parasites are found, medication will be prescribed and then an additional fecal sample should be tested 3-4 weeks later
- Flea control should be bought for your kitten.

SPAY OR NEUTER

- Plan for this at or after 6 months of age

If you are interested in pet insurance, plan to get your policy as soon as possible. Healthy kittens have no restrictions to their policy.

Know where your local 24-hour emergency hospital is located before you need it.
